Only Jesus can save us

Would it be controversial to say that this country is in a mess? Clergy aren't supposed to be controversial – oops – but we really do seem to have taken a severely wrong turn somewhere. What are we to do? Where are we to go? How shall we resist? And what has Jesus got to do with it?

Let's take the proposed redevelopments in Backwell. If reports are to be believed we are looking at doubling the population of Backwell in the coming years, which might be all well and good if everything that goes along with an increase in population was also addressed — like medical provision, or transport needs, or public space. My question, my invitation, is: why aren't these things also being addressed?

There is a story that could be told here about the way in which the human being has been reduced to the status of an economic unit, a changeable and replaceable widget in the great factory of a modern economy. We are just steel ball-bearings, mass produced, useful for a purpose but discarded if not smooth enough. At least, that is how it feels when I'm stuck in a phone call listening to the robotic voice intoning 'your call is important to us'. Yeah, right.

What is missing in our modern economy, and it applies so obviously when it comes to housing developments, is any idea that we human beings are soulful creatures. There is more to us than the contribution that we can make to GDP. It matters that we can do the things that human beings need to do, like meet together, like look after our vulnerable and sick, like play in the fresh air, like sing and dance and love. Most of this doesn't turn up on the GDP balance sheet or – worse – things that are actually terrible end up being a contribution to the size of the economy, so they get incentivised even when they make our human lives much worse.

What would it look like if we started to build Backwell as if people mattered? What would be the balance between new homes and new facilities, and how would we arrange for people to move around? I have no confidence that the metropolitan bubble-dwellers in Whitehall have any idea (once upon a time I was one...!)

At the risk of sounding like a bible-basher, we have been in similar messes before, and there are lots of relevant stories in the Bible that have something to say about the mess that we are in – I'm rather hoping that we're more in a Tower of Babel situation than a Noah's Ark situation, but I'm not confident of that. What I am confident about is that we will not get to answers for the problems that surround us unless we recognise that we need to treat each other – and be treated by others – as full human beings, with deeprooted needs that cannot fit onto an accountant's spreadsheet (vital and useful though such things are in their proper context).

If we accept that we need to function on a human scale with these questions, we need to have some idea of what a fully human life looks like, what it would mean for each and every one of us to flourish and become the people, individually and communally, that we were created to be.

Which is why only Jesus can save us. If we want to know what being human looks like, and what that flourishing life looks like, and what we have to do in order to share in that life, each of us and Backwell as a whole as we ponder all these developments, then we would do well to contemplate the one 'in whom we live and move and have our being'. In the midst of our contemporary glooms and dooms he is the one surpassing light who can guide us.

Backwell Parish Council June Meeting

It was noted that Cllr Ould had unanimously been returned as Parish Council Chair. Cllrs Harris and Lloyd were unanimously elected as joint vice-chairs.

Two residents raised concerns about airport-related parking around Downside Park, including threats from landowners, access



issues for emergency vehicles, and traffic congestion. Cllrs Harland and Power outlined reporting options and assured residents that the Parish Council continues to monitor and report issues, working with Bristol Airport and NSC.

Cllr Ould reported that Nailsea Town Council had raised concerns about a new application for 200 houses near Netherton Grange, despite a lack of infrastructure, unsold existing homes, and already congested roads. Given the potential impact on Backwell, Cllr Ould proposed that BPC object in support of NTC.

Planning Cllr Harland, as Chair of the Planning Committee, reported on several planning issues affecting Backwell:

Farleigh Fields East No response had been received from North Somerset Council regarding BPC's concerns about the draining and level situation. This has been chased up.

Farleigh Fields West (Land off Dark Lane) No update

Rodney Road Clirs Harland and Power will be meeting with Taylor Wimpey for a preconstruction discussion on outstanding matters. Representatives from Backwell Playing Fields Charity, who are concerned about their boundary, the levels, access and compound, will attend for part of the meeting.

The road names are still under discussion. Cllrs Taylor and Power will attend Court on behalf of BPC if necessary.

It was emphasised that the Taylor Wimpey's access plans must explicitly reference the Strawberries and Cream tree, noting it as one of only two of its genus in the UK. Full details of BPC's stipulated conditions are available on the website.

Gleeson Proposals (South Nailsea) No update

Grove Farm Both BPC and the District Councillor will be involved in the discussions about building conditions, assisted by Lucy White, an independent planning consultant employed by BPC.

Even Keel (Land off Moor Lane) No update

East Backwell Councillors unanimously agrees that members of BPC should meet with MicMac to discuss their forthcoming application to build on fields there.

Local Green Space There is to be a hearing in relation to the Local Green Space proposal. BPC will write as an interested party.

Planning Applications Councillors voted unanimously to continue to object to the application for permission in principle to build three dwellings to the south of 7 Backwell Hill. The area is Green Belt and in a Conservation Area.

Bus Service Improvement Scheme (BSIP) BPC remains opposed to the scheme in Backwell and continue to meet with the NSC team to ensure that residents' views are heard.

Bristol Airport Concerns were expressed about the absence of a bus stop at the layby for children to access school buses. This issue will be pursued by Cllr Harland, and Councillors agreed that the Lighthouse Trust should be asked to lend their support.

Concerns were also expressed about the speed limits in local lanes and it was felt that the national speed limit should be reduced to 30 or 40mph.

The ongoing problems with airport users parking in the station and lake parks was also discussed. It was hoped that police and other agencies would take action to address the problem where possible.

Enhancement Councillors unanimously approved a four-year contract for the Christmas lights.

Rights of Way Cllr Power reported that the situation at Long Lane appears to have settled. She and Cllr Harland will visit the area to confirm that the issues have been properly resolved.

Cllr Power reported that a stile near the Leisure Centre is in very poor condition. She is hoping to contact the landowner with a view to installing a kissing gate instead.

The next full meeting of the Council will be held at the Parish Hall on **Thursday**, **3**rd **July** 2025 **at the earlier time of 6.00pm**

Backwell Residents Association (BRA)

At present there is huge building and planning activity in Backwell – here are some of the major happenings.

Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP)

Plans by the North Somerset Council(NSC) BSIP team to move to the next stage of BSIP Backwell, included a bus lane opposite the Leisure Centre, the use of GPS technology to give approaching buses priority at the traffic lights, a puffin crossing (similar to the one by the Post Office) near the leisure centre, and moving the crossroads Bristol bound bus stop to near the Post Office. Backwell Parish Council (BPC) and BRA opposed the proposals for a bus lane, and a bus stop near the Post Office. BRA conducted a survey of its members to gauge their opinion on the four proposals. There was support for the use of GPS and the puffin crossing but 98% of the 255 respondents opposed the bus lane.

The proposals were rejected by a scrutiny panel at Weston on May 27th with a vote by NSC Councillors of 6-2. Unfortunately, our "stand-in" NSC councillors did not object, but others spoke well in opposing it. The best outcome would be for the GPS and puffin crossing to be implemented, and the bus lane and bus stop move be removed from the plan. It seems however that, despite knowing their unpopularity on safety and cost grounds, modified plans may be brought forward by the BSIP team for a decision.

Rodney Road - 65 houses by the Scout Hut

Taylor Wimpey(TW) is progressing this development with detailed plans, and BRA is working with BPC to set conditions for TW operations. Safety of school children is paramount, along with the many users of the Scout Hut and Playing Fields, plus parking issues on inadequate roads, which are being addressed by restricted times of site working and deliveries, and parking for site operatives etc.

Farleigh Fields (East) 96 houses

Persimmon has started building houses near to the A370 access and is marketing them (for example a poster by the ticket machine at the station, with a QR code). The huge pile of earth has naturally caused much anxiety, but this is **not** shown on the approved plans. It is temporary and is due to be removed. The Planning Enforcement team at NSC has visited the site regularly and is in contact with Persimmon, and says it "will continue to monitor the development to ensure that it is built in line with the approval given"

Farleigh Fields Local Green Space

BPC continues to give detailed consideration to the option to purchase this area.

STOP PRESS North Somerset Local Plan (up to 2040)

NSC has just produced the latest draft of its Local Plan. This puts an extra 1,000 houses in our Green Belt, in addition to 800 at Grove Farm and other already approved sites. Details are on our website, under "News & Hot Topics".


