Parish Council Report - October 2025

Councillors were sorry to accept Cllr Barclay's resignation and expressed appreciation for her years of dedicated service.

Planning

Farleigh Fields West (Land off Dark Lane). Cllr Harland informed

members that the grass had been cut; the contractor left the top area uncut for wildlife and avoided the two large trees.

Local Green Space. Cllr Harland reported that an offer is expected shortly.

Rodney Road. Cllr Harland reported that she, Cllr Power, and Dt Cllr Petty are closely monitoring the development and have visited the site. NSC Enforcement had visited the site for a spot check. A resident has reported dust issues. Cllr Harland advised the resident to report this to NSC Enforcement and stated she would also relay the concern to Taylor Wimpey (TW).

Neighbourhood Plan Clir Harland informed members that the current Neighbourhood Plan is being reviewed to bring it in line with the National Planning Framework, together with the adopted and emerging Local Plan. This will act as a term of reference for any speculative planning applications in the interim, thereby strengthening what we currently have.

Planning Applications Councillors unanimously objected to a proposal at Cherrywood, Backwell Hill Road as the site is within the Green Belt and situated on a narrow rural lane.

The Airport Councillors unanimously objected to an application to discharge a condition relating to the foul water drainage scheme. It was felt that some important requirements might not have been required regarding a contract with Wessex Water or similar authority to receive the waste, and that no comments had been sought from the Internal Drainage Board.

Bus Services Improvement Plan (BSIP)
Cllr Harland updated that she met D/Cllr Hannah
Young. They thanked Cllr Young for reconsidering
her decision and proceeding with the GPS bus
priority lights only. Cllr Sharkey raised that there
have been issues following the installation of the new
bus stop by The George. This is being taken up with
the contractors.

Safety at The Crescent Residents told the Council that they were very worried about the dangers to students at the junction with Station Road. There has been a meeting in The Crescent between the local PCSO and Backwell School's Headmaster to assess the situation. Cllr Taylor suggested allowing parents to drop-off in the school car park. The PCSO has been asked to visit the site more regularly.

Other Matters Cllrs Ould and Taylor had met with the NSC CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) and had been given clearer guidance on eligible spending. Some may be used to replace the irreparable roundabout at Moor Lane with one that is accessible to all.

Cllr Ould further reported that CIL money could be used to fund a digital noticeboard in the village. The next Parish Council Meeting will be held on Thursday, 6th November in Backwell Parish Hall at

7:30pm. All are welcome to attend.

Parish Council Christmas events!

The Over 60's Tea Party is on Thursday 27th November 2025 from 2-5pm and the Carols Around the Crib is to be held on Thursday 11th December from 6.30pm. Both at the Parish Hall. Both are free entry. An update from your District Councillor. While I write this in October I am anticipating that at a meeting on 15th October it is likely that the North Somerset Council Cabinet will have voted for the next stage of the Local Plan process to have taken place. It is expected that in November members of the public will be able to respond to a consultation on the latest version of the local plan for the period 2026-2041. The draft Local Plan has massive housing targets set by the national government, far stripping the local housing needs. I do hope you will take the time to comment. Backwell has already had large housing developments given approval at Grove Farm, Farleigh Fields, off Rodney Road and off Dark Lane. Additional sites in this draft include Green Belt sites East of Backwell, covering from near the Leisure Centre to Farleigh. There are also large sites allocated to Nailsea, which we know will have an impact on our village.

I have been challenging the council, that if this goes ahead the plan must deliver high quality housing, on Green Belt the Green Group of councillors have pushed for 50% affordable housing, an increased number with disabled access. We need developments that value green space, spaces for nature and green corridors for the protected species locally. The East of Backwell sites propose a road to link A370 to Station Road near Backwell Lake. This is a massive undertaking that would ease our congestion issues on Station Road and the crossroads. However, this has the potential to be very costly to deliver. I think an important point in the consultation will be how to deliver this and other infrastructure at a time when it is needed and not risk having a scheme that is undeliverable. There will be a link on the council website (n-somerset.gov.uk) to respond to this draft Local Plan.

I attended a Health meeting yesterday run by the Council's Public Health team and they raised two key messages. One to recommend that those able to get their winter vaccines do take them up whether this is due to age or preexisting conditions, it may be that if you are a carer you can also benefit from a flu jab. The other is that by being a good neighbour and checking in on each other we can keep isolation down, we know sooner if someone is struggling and we may be able to support them get shopping in a number of ways. I am aware that in the past we have had power cuts and harsh storms so have been thinking about how we as a community can support each other. I will continue to work with partners in the community to think about this.

Backwell Scout News (Part 2)

1st Backwell Scouts AGM Report - 18-9-2025

1st Backwell Scout Group held its 2025 Annual General meeting on Thursday 18th September, where the Group Lead Volunteer gave an overview of Scouting in Backwell over the past year.

There are currently 200 young people taking part every week across the group, comprising 44 Beavers, 49 Cubs, 62 Scouts and 45 Explorers. We also have a substantial waiting list for each of the sections with a total of 104 young people waiting to join

The sections have all been busy throughout the year providing fun and challenging activities to give our young people new skills and adventures.

The two scout sections ran summer camps, one at Lulworth Castle Estate, featuring activities like coasteering, paddle boarding and "Masterchef" cooking challenge and one at Cranham Scout Centre with a focus on fun, friendship, and outdoor challenges.

Scouts also participated in the Cotswold marathon night hike and successfully planned and completed a 2day expedition in the Gower, Wales

Both cub sections enjoyed camps at Glenny Wood and a joint summer camp at our Hut, featuring hikes,

traditional camp pioneering and target air rifle shooting.

A small group of Cubs represented 1st Backwell on "The Repair Shop" on the television when two of the experts restored our Wolf's Head during the summer.

Beavers' activities included visits to the Scout site at Glenny Wood, den building, gardening, stargazing, campfire cooking, and seasonal celebrations, while the Explorers section enjoyed an exciting summer trip to Amsterdam during the summer holidays.

We are very lucky to have the use of the Scout & Guide HQ and the responsibility for this has now been transferred to the Scout Group Board of Trustees. We have also this year become a registered charity which will make grant applications and employee match funding much easier to administer.

The current Group Chair, Paul Morris, was voted in again as Group Chair for a period of three years. We're still actively seeking someone to take over as Group Treasurer to replace Matt Dobbs who is stepping down after ten years' service.

It was noted at the AGM that Backwell Scouts purchased a replacement minibus this year supported by grants from Stancombe quarry, Backwell Parish Council, Backwell Masonic Lodge and Nailsea Community Trust for which we are extremely grateful.

We'd like to thank our sponsors for their generosity which allows us to continue to offer our young people opportunities further afield as demonstrated by the many camps, hikes and other adventurous activities run throughout the year.

By the time this magazine is distributed at the end of October, the consultation document for the draft North Somerset Local Plan 2041 will have been published by North Somerset Council (NSC). If this Plan is implemented, Backwell will almost double from its current size, of around 2,000, to not far short of 4,000 houses. National government has been the driving force for the additional housing needs in North Somerset, but Backwell Parish Council (BPC), Backwell Residents Association (BRA) and Backwell Resistance (BR) all consider that Backwell is being asked to contribute much more than its fair share of new housing.

The increase comes from 3 sources:

- Housing under construction Farleigh Fields East; (Farleigh Road); and Rodney Road
- Housing already approved by NSC Grove Farm; 2. Farleigh Fields West (Dark Lane)
- New housing sites proposed in the Draft North Somerset Local Plan 2041

There is nothing that residents can do to stop the houses from the first two categories. There is however an opportunity to object to the new allocations. These would put almost 1,000 houses on the Grade 1 Agricultural Greenbelt Land in the area between Backwell School playing fields, Farleigh Road and Chapel Hill. The implications of this change for highways, flooding, ecology, and the character of our village are huge, and are being evaluated by a number of professional experts.

In the first half of November, BPC, BRA and BR plan to deliver a leaflet to every household in Backwell. This will explain the Local Plan proposals in detail, and how to make your comment to NSC, which needs to be done by early December. We urge everyone to make their views known.

Welcome to Year 5 (aged 9,10)

We hit the ground running this term conducting science experiments on exploring the different properties of materials including absorption rates and testing for buoyancy, magnetism and ability to repel water (waterproof status). We could one day see Backwell and Nailsea joined and become a commuter town for Bristol.

Geoff's talk provoked lively discussions about the potential problems which could result from such expansion to our village. There will be opportunities in the coming months for residents to make their concerns known


