Backwell Parish Council Meeting August

With regret, Councillors accepted the resignation of Cllr David Lloyd. He was thanked for all his contributions to the work of the Council.

Councillors voted unanimously to accept the application of James Sharkey to be co-opted onto the Council.

Planning

Farleigh Fields East Cllr Harland informed BPC that the show home is open with four units sold. Further earth movements are pending. Cllr Harland explained that the drainage and surface water conditions have now been signed off.

Farleigh Fields West (land off Dark Lane) Cllr Harland informed Councillors that the number of houses to be built had reduced to 96.

Councillors unanimously agreed to explore working with an independent expert to further examine the proposed Dark Lane mitigation, to check for effectiveness and safety as it is a major route to school and connective branch of the village.

Cllr Horner raised concerns over drainage and Councillors agreed that the Council should raise this at the reserved matters stage to avoid a repeat of Farleigh Field East level and giant bunds.

Local Green Space (LGS) Cllr Harland reported that the LGS (middle fields) offer from Persimmon is imminent, as the first house will be occupied in November.

Councillors thanked Michael Pratt from BRA, for his thorough work on the LGS to assist the Council.

Rodney Road Cllr Harland updated Councillors on the site activity and Taylor Wimpey's ongoing efforts to work with BPC and other interested parties. Cllr Harland discussed issues neighbouring properties, noise, dust, HGVs reversing and mounting the pavements. The loss of wildlife, habitat and mature trees have also been reported.

Taylor Wimpey is working to finish the site entrance before school term starts in September. Cllr Harland informed Councillors that some TW staff had been verbally abused.

Cllr Harland proposed that a statement about the current work should be issued by BPC to keep residents informed.

Councillors heard that Taylor Wimpey had applied for double yellow lines to be installed along the length of Rodney Road for the duration of the building work. Councillors accepted that the use of yellow lines will be approved by North Somerset Council. Councillors will press for single lines only, with designated times to allow residents to park on the road during the evenings and weekends. Cllrs Taylor and Power will consider the options and submit a response with BPC's opinion and recommendations.

Cllr Harland informed Councillors that there had been positive movements with the Management Plans, NSC, Taylor Wimpey are prepared to work with residents and BPC for the best outcome.

Land North of Farleigh Road Councillors heard that no planning application had yet been made, but the developers, MacMic, were scoping for an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for the erection of around 500 houses with some mixed-use development. Councillors were adamant that the EIA must take into account all the environmental factors, including but not limited to, horseshoe bats, other wildlife, drainage and surface water.

Other Planning Matters There were no updates on the Gleeson proposals (land north of Backwell) or Grove Farm. Cllrs Harland and Power will be making a site visit to Long Lane at the old BT site shortly.

Local Plan Cllr Harland formally thanked BRA for their unwavering support in BPC's endeavours and for their financial aid, without which BPC would be unable to be as effective. It was agreed that there would be a joint response from BPC and BRA to the most recent proposals. It was further agreed that legal advice would be taken to ensure that the village response was robust.

Backwell Scouts and Guides – Tree branch reduction Councillors heard that an application had been made to address problems with the trees overhanging their Hut and other buildings in the vicinity. Unanimously, Councillors voted to defer to the Tree Officer, and request that he also review some of the trees overhanging the children's activity centres.

Backwell Junior School Councillors supported an application from the school to undertake some improvements which would modernise the buildings. The plans were sympathetic to the building's heritage and would provide much needed additional facilities.

Playground Councillors heard from Cllr Taylor that the roundabout at Moor Lane Play Area needs replacement. Cllr Taylor was asked to make enquiries as to the cost of an accessible roundabout as a replacement.

Bus Service Improvement Plan Cllr Hatcher informed Councillors that a meeting with D/Councillor Young and Cllr Harland had taken place where there were challenging and helpful discussions. D/Councillor Young confirmed that the BSIP scheme had not yet been agreed to proceed in full but was still at the design stage. She will report back to BPC in September.

Bristol Airport Cllr Taylor and Cllr Martin reported that a meeting had taken place where BPC's request for local highway changes had been discussed. Cllr Taylor will prepare a written report, detailing the requested changes, for official consideration by the Airport.

The next full Parish council meeting will be held at 7.30pm on **Thursday, 4th September** 2025 at the Parish Hall. All would be most welcome to attend.

Backwell Residents Association (BRA)

Here are some updates on the many current developments in Backwell, including both present building sites, and important public consultations on possible other developments expected shortly.

North Somerset Local Plan (2040) (LP)

The current version of the LP includes sites already approved by North Somerset Council (NSC); the largest of which is for 515 houses on Grove Farm. Unfortunately, it also includes two major sites for 500 and 450 houses in East Backwell on Green Belt land. These sites cover virtually all the fields bounded by the railway line, Farleigh Road and Chapel Hill.

A public consultation is expected soon, and this will be Backwell's only significant opportunity to join together to object and have our say. This extra housing over a 15-year period is unsustainable for Backwell, which currently is a village of 2,000 houses, with limited infrastructure.

BRA continues to work closely with Backwell Parish Council (BPC) and has made donations to employ planning expertise to give us the best advice to safeguard East Backwell.

We will contact members as soon as the consultation opens and suggest how residents can best help. With enough comments we still have a chance to influence the decision.

Proposal for 450 houses East of Backwell

At the Drop-in Session in the Parish Hall in July, MacMic Strategic Land Development claimed that their 450 homes site could have 500 homes built, with vehicular access from a new junction with signals on Farleigh Road opposite Fairfield Way.

It is expected that a planning application will be made to NSC shortly. BRA strongly opposes this major development and will be in touch with members if and when an application is made.

65 Houses off Rodney Road (Ref 20/P/1847/OUT and 24/P/0533/RM)

Taylor Wimpey (TW) has started preparatory work on this development,

with its very narrow access onto already busy roads. There has been much activity between TW, NSC, BPC and others, which is given in some detail on the BPC website. Go to www.backwell-pc.gov.uk, and Reports/Posts/ and Rodney Road/Taylor Wimpey. At

the time of writing, we are expecting to hear details from NSC of parking restrictions to enable HGV access and to maintain safe use of the road to access shops etc.

Farleigh Fields (East) 96 houses

Persimmon has already built several houses near the A370 access, and a show house is now operating Thursday to Sunday from 10.00am to 5.00pm. Persimmon expects some 10 houses to be completed by the end of the year.

Farleigh Fields Local Green Space BRA understands that Persimmon will shortly be making an offer to BPC to purchase the land for £1. BPC continues to give detailed consideration and conduct due diligence of the short- and long-term aspects of this land ownership.

Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP)

On Tuesday 27th May BRA was pleased to hear that the BSIP team was being asked by an internal NSC Scrutiny Panel to reconsider its plans for BSIP Backwell, given the major opposition from some NSC Councillors, BPC, and BRA whose survey included a 98% rejection of the bus lane along Farleigh Road, by 255 BRA households who responded,

The leader of the BSIP team, Hannah Young, (NSC Member for Highways and Transport) produced a 16 page report in response to the findings of the Scrutiny Panel which repeats the main goal of BSIP Backwell to reduce the time taken for the round trip Weston to Bristol and back. It estimates that the bus lane would save 58 seconds for buses to Weston in the late afternoon peak period.

The bus lane is still at the feasibility and design stage, and no formal decision to proceed to build has been made. We expect to hear more from the BSIP team in early autumn. It has been made aware of the intensity of local opposition to the bus lane and to moving the bus stop from the crossroads to outside the Post Office.




